

"Heavens, the front-door beth." Exclaimed Glarissa, staying her needle. Roused, she listened.





"How heavenly it is to see you again!" she ex-






Why consider character networks?

Network analysis gives us many ways to quantify characteristics of a network:

- the number of connections each node has
- how important each node is for bridging disparate parts of the network
- the communities and clusters within the network
- the number of connected components
- the average number of hops to get between any two nodes
- network diameter (widest distance from one end to the other)

Literary questions we might answer using networks

- how do conversation networks differ between rural and urban novels in the 19th Century? (Elson..., 2010, 2012)
 - 60 novels analyzed using quoted speech attribution
 - (they don't)
- how do literary characteristics relate to character network characteristics? (Sack 2014; Alexander, unreleased)
- how big can a network get before readers can't keep track of characters anymore (Alexander)
- is there an inverse between amount of dialog and # of


It is proposed to sail tomorrow. Perhaps however, it may not be till next day. Mr. Dana will come on board at Nine tomorrow.

Your Aunt has given me a Barrell of Cramberries. I shall make a good Use of them, I hope.




Drawbacks

How can we address these drawbacks?


An application that...


- keeps track of annotations
 - entity/mention locations
 - tie locations
- allows different workflows
 - manual annotation
 - automated annotation
 - semi-automated annotation
- allows (encourages!) sharing
 - and forking
- made with general end users in mind
 - literary scholars, historians, lawyers, etc.
 - not just linguists and computational linguists












EntiTies as a research framework

- in the literature, there are several techniques to
 - o identify entities and their mentions in text
 - extract ties between entities in a segment of text
- which work best? and for which use cases?
- EntiTies has a built in user study feature
 - o a study consists of tasks
 - links to external resources, e.g., a Qualtrics questionnaire
 - annotation tasks
 - tasks can be grouped into orderings
 - interactions with the annotation interface are logged for analysis

Research & Development

- version 1: Demonstration paper at CHIIR 2020
- pilot study (Sam's Twentieth Century Fiction class); n=21
 - test the interface
 - o initial evaluation of workflows: manual vs. semi-automated vs. fully automated
 - test the study system (interface, data collection & analysis)
- this summer
 - improve interface
 - reduce clicking + scrolling, iron out glitches
 - more network viz options
 - smart recommendations when you highlight or click on a mention or tie
 - o implement and improve upon algorithms for:
 - entity identification (targeted to other text types: historical, news, legal, etc.)
 - link extraction (Agarwal et al. 2010–2016)

Future directions

- user studies
 - students using it for class activities
 - o scholars using it for their research
- recruit instructors use EntiTies in their classes
 - let me know if you're interested!
- recruit scholars to use it in their research
 - could you use EntiTies for your research?
- apply for NEH or NSF grants
 - targeted towards further developing and using EntiTies
